





(2) Export Control vs. Industry/Academia


UN Resolution 1540 is mandatory for member country to comply with.

Basic duty for industry/academia

Resolution 1540 also says "should not hamper international cooperation in material, equipment and technology for peaceful purposes".

Secure continued access to high technology

- ➤ Illegal export of sensitive goods and technology transfer, may expose Industry/Academia to serious crisis by significantly destabilizing world peace.
- Introduction of effective export control system is a key parameter to protect Industry/Academia and ultimately maintain its high reputation.

(3) Advantage to introduce export control system

Export control is not only a responsibility but can be a benefit for Industry/Academia and Country.

For Industry/Academia Level

- Unexpected cost is to be prevented by mitigating risk of legal violation.
- Enjoy good reputation as a trustworthy entity who has effective operation procedures.
- Contributing to higher efficiency/achievement

For Country Level

Good reputation as a responsible country with effective export control, earns trust from trade partner countries.


